April 27, & 28, 2024

AIS Region 7 Spring Board Meeting - April 27, 2024 hosted by MTIS Middle Tennessee Iris Society held at the Hilton Inn and Suites, Brentwood, Nashville, TN.

RVP Lorene Crone called the meeting to order at 4:37 pm, thanking all those in attendance which were Susan Driver, Mary Ann Duncan, Jim Vernon, Scott Hall, Denise Flowers and others.

Minutes from the fall meeting were in the Irisarian, with no additions or corrections.

Treasurers Report: Jim Vernon passed out the treasurers report to board members, with an ending balance of 13,611.80. Treasurers report accepted as read. Audit of the treasure was done at the fall meeting, the auditors were Stephanie Plummer, Maryann Duncan, and Ernie Royal. All looked good with the audit to the Trustees. Lorene said Robert Treadwell our judges training speaker donated a truckload of irises to be auctioned which will help offset some of the meeting expenses.

Newsletter Editor: Susan Driver stated that the deadline to get show pictures and details of local shows to her will be between Aug 1st and Aug 1sth. This will give her time to get them in the Irisarian Newsletter.

Judges Report: Lorene Crone reported several judges had retired but they can still judge as long as they keep up their membership and judge with an active judge. Lorene said Chad Harris will be coming and do our judges training for the fall meeting 2024. Caroline Winters said she had fly miles that could used to help with his airfare.

Webmaster: Scott Hall stated he regularly updates the website with current information.

Awards Committee: Denise Flowers stated the deadline for award nominations must be sent to her by July 1st, in order to get awards ordered. Also to enter the youth essay contest can be found on the AIS website.

Lorene said she had talked with the pastor at Lake Benson, Bon Aqua, TN. about having the winter pot luck at Lake Benson she has not heard back at this time. Also that the rate may have gone up a few dollars but not much.

Lorene said Maryann Duncan's term as trustee is expiring this fall. We need to be considering someone for this position possibly someone from the Kentucky societies.

Lorene said she had assigned a committee of three Barb Papenfuss, Marilyn Vernon, and Sue Ann Barnes, plus Jim Vernon to look at and update Region 7 Travel and Reimbursement Policy. Barb discussed what the committee had proposed for the updated policy to be voted on at the fall 2024 meeting. Jim Vernon made the motion that we continue to cover the cost of our 2 AIS board members to go to the AIS convention covering their registration, basic transportation, and hotel costs until this fall when the updated policy can be voted on. This motion was seconded by Maryann Duncan and was voted on and approved by the board.

Jim Vernon thanked everyone for attending the AIS Region 7 meeting hosted by MTIS and coming to Nashville and participating in the show which had 152 stalks of iris.

Lorene said that was all she had on her agenda and adjourned the meeting at 5:49.


